WSFPI auction planned for Nov.

The tribal receivership process for Warm Springs Forest Products Industries will involve the auction of assets at the mill site.

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The receivership, managed by Edward Hostmann Inc., is a tribal court process.

The receiver has proposed a three-day auction at the mill site, from November 15 to 17. The tribal court judge in the case will consider the proposal at a hearing set for October 14.

In these kinds of auctions, most of the bidders will be at the auction site, Mr.

Hostmann said. There could be some on-line bidding, but most will be on hand to view the items, he said.

The idea is to have approximately eight-hour auctions over the three days, Mr. Hostmann said: Experience has shown that very lengthy auction days, lasting for example up to 12 hours, are not as productive.

There can be an average of up to 100 items auctioned per hour.

At the least, the WSFPI equipment will be auctioned. Some items will be sold as scrap metal.

Eventually, the idea is to sell the mill assets including the buildings, down to the foundations. There is currently some question as to who owns the buildings, WSFPI or the tribes. Resolution of this question will determine whether the planned November auction will include the mill buildings themselves.

The tribes meanwhile are establishing a timber company that will generate revenue to fund, for instance, the Senior Pension fund.
