Cowdeo youth rodeo turning 48

The Cowdeo youth rodeo returns October 15 to the Jefferson County Fairgrounds. Warm Springs is always well-represented at the Cowdeo: Last year young Isaiah Florendo won the All Around Cowdeo Saddle, donated by DMJ Automotive of Warm Springs. Isaiah won four prize buckles on his way to the All Around Saddle. The Cowdeo draws young cowboys and cowgirls from around the Northwest for the competitions. The kids compete in their age division—5, 6-8 PeeWee, 9-11 Junior, and 12-14 Senior—for belt buckles in each event. The Cowdeo event categories include: Goat decorating, horseless calf roping,

breakaway calf roping, sheep riding, calf riding, cow riding, barrel racing, scurry races, and the chicken scramble. The Fairgrounds has hosted the Cowdeo since 1968, with the event this year celebrating its Forty-Eight year anniversary. "The Cowdeo is really fun for participants and spectators alike," said Brian Crow, Fairgrounds event coordinator. "The kids make this event exciting. It is really fun to watch them compete." The Cowdeo is operated by an all-volunteer staff who pour their heart and soul into producing a first-class youth rodeo spectacle. "They truly love the sport and the kids who come to compete," Mr. Crow said.

Show time is at noon on Saturday, October 15. Tickets are \$5 at the door, and kids under the age 4 are free. The Cowdeo originated in 1968 by the St. Patrick's Catholic Church as a fund-raising opportunity. The Fairgrounds took over in 2003, turning the Cowdeo into a fund-raiser not only for the Fair Complex but for other organizations. The Jefferson County Fire Department, 4-H, FFA Alumni, Culver Parent Club Organization, St. Patrick's Youth Group, and the Central Oregon High School Rodeo Team are some of the groups that have benefited from the Cowdeo.

There will be a food handler's class on Monday, October 10 from 2-4 p.m. in the IHS atrium. This allows participants to receive their food handler's certificate for the food service industry.
