School district board positions on May ballot

The Jefferson County School District 509-J has two positions opening on its board of directors.

The open seats are 509-J position No. 4 and No. 5.

The election will be on May 21, in a vote-by-mail special election.

There is time to register to vote in the election, or to update your voter registration.

The deadline is April 30. If you register online, at oregonvotes.org, you would have until 11:59 p.m. on April 30 to register.

County jail

Jefferson County is also proposing a 3-year jail operating levy on the

May ballot.

An earlier 5-year levy proposal failed at the polls.

The county reduced the proposal to the three years, and is re-submitting the question on the May 21 ballot. The ballot question reads:

Shall a tax of \$1.39 per \$1,000 assessed value be levied for jail operations commencing FY 2019-2020 for three years?

Passage of this measure would cause property taxes to increase more than three percent. Reservation and trust property of the Confederated Tribes is not taxes, so this aspect of the measure would not apply to the tribes.
