Some parents might be at work during the day, for instance, leaving students to study on their own.

Consider the idea of 'summer learning loss,' defined as, "The loss of academic skills and knowledge over the course of the long summer holiday." This kind of learning loss happens every year, as the students are away from school for the

The goal at present is to make sure that 'summer learning loss' is not magnified by these lost school days of spring.

The district workers on Tuesdays and Thursdays distribute the Distance Learning materials at the drop-off sites (see page 6). The educators meanwhile engage the students and parents as much as possible, under the circumstances.

For now about half of the 509-I school district families have home internet access, meaning that education platforms like 'Google Classroom' are available only to some. Others have access to through Smart Phones, "and that is also a great strategy," Parshall

Ideally, the home internet access would be available to all student households. And this is a goal in the long-term for a district like 509-J, covering many square miles, much of it rural. Yet like all aspects of society, education is becoming more computerized and digital; young people especially are aware of this.

The current health crisis is showing how education may change in the not so distant future; and the school district is planning to make this shift. In spite of all challenges, "I think there are good things that will come from this," Mr. Parshall said.
