Which One?

Hold up TWO flashcards and ask students to listen and point to the flashcard for the item that you say.

Mnkní áwa aswainmí táatpas?	Which one is the boy's shirt?
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What is it?

Hold up a flashcard and ask students to identify it.

Tun chi iwá?	What is this?
Walách'wich iwá.	It's a belt.

Do you see this or that?

Hold up a flashcard and ask the students if they see one thing or another thing. Make sure one of the choices is the item on the flashcard. The other item can be any other kind of clothing. Let the students listen to the two choices, and then say which one they see.

Míshpam aq'ínusha tilatalfna amísh q'pq'plína?	Do you see a pair of pants or a pair of shoes?
Q'pq'plínatash aq'ínusha.	We see a pair of shoes.
Aq'ínushatash q'pq'plína.	We see a pair of shoes.

What do you see?

Hold up a flashcard and ask the students what they see.

Míshpam túna aq'ínusha?	What do you see?
Aq'ínushatash stkna.	We see socks.

3. Closure:
Tell the students they are doing a good job.

Niix pamkú!	You're doing good!
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4. Follow-Up:
Make two groups and have a competition where students pick a flashcard and say what it is. If they are right, their group gets a point.

RESOURCES:

- Flashcards of clothing: girl's dress, scarf, necklace, coat, blue jeans, underwear, shoe, backpack, socks, sweater, clothes, jewelry, bracelet, dress, hat, pair of pants, belt, braid ties (for women), boy's shirt, gloves

EVALUATION:

The teacher will observe the students and keep a checklist of their accomplishments.

GOAL:

For students to learn the Paiute words and phrases for items of warm winter clothing, and directions for putting on their warmy clothes. To have fun putting on warmy clothes and getting ready to go outside into the cold.

OBJECTIVES: The student will be able to:

- Follow directions to put on warm winter clothes to go outside into the cold, for full control.
- Follow directions to come inside and take off and put away warm winter clothes, for full control.
- Name the items of warm winter clothes, for partial control.

PROCEDURES:

- Introduction:
Tell the students that everyone will go outside into the cold -- but first they will put on their warm clothes.

Tamme puwanatoo meakwe.	Let's go outside.
Tamme hoonakwatoo mea.	Let's go outside.
Hoonakwatoo unu utsutsu.	It's cold outside.

Here re my Warm Clothes

Set out socks, snow boots, coat, hat, gloves, and scarf. Tell what each of th items are, and have the students repeat the words for each item of warm clothes.

Ya'a: tasopa.	Here's my socks.
sanamoko	snow boots .. Rubber Boots
kooodu	coat
tsotu'a	hat
masato	gloves
haakutsabu	scarf

Put on your Warm Clothes

Give directions to the students to put on their warm clothes. Use the TPR teaching technique. Repeat several times, until the students can follow the commands well.

U tá pawi haneo.	Put on your socks.
U sá mokowi haneo.	Put on your rubber boots.
U m' atowi haneo.	Put on your gloves or mittens.
U k'oduwi haneo.	Put on your coat.
U ts'á'awi haneo.	Put on your hat.
U h' utsabuwi haneo.	Put on your scarf.

Take Off and Put Away your Warm Clothes

Give directions to the students to take off and put away their warm clothes. Use the TPR teaching technique. Repeat several times, until the students can follow the commands comfortably.

U kooodu tsaweneoo.	Hang up your coat.
U tsotu'a ya'a tuku.	Put your hat right here.
U haakutsabu ya'a tuku.	Put your scarf right here.
U masatio tsakwumow.	Take off your mittens.
U masatio ebee toonow.	Put away your gloves.
U sanamoko ebee toonow.	Put away your boots.

3. Closure:

Go Outside & Play!

When the students have learned to follow these directions, have everybody go outside in the cold. After everyone has played outside in the cold for a little while, have them come back in and get warm by the fire.

Mitoo keimnow.	Come inside now.
Ya'a kos'oba yooepunne.	Get warm by the fire.

4. Follow-Up:
Repeat this lesson from time to time until the students can do it well.
If students want to write down the words and phrases, you can write them on a whiteboard and have them copy them into their notebooks.
Say the single words for the key items and actions, and have everybody listen and repeat. Focus on the following words:

utsutsu	cold
hoonakwatoo	outside
tasop	socks
sanamoko	snow boots - Rubber Boots
kooodu	coat
tsotu'	hat
masatu	gloves
haakutsabu	scarf
tsakwumow	take off
tsaweneoo	hang up
ya'a tuku	put here, set here
ebee toonow	put away
ya'a tucnow	put here, put away here

RESOURCES:

- cold weather, warm fire
- coat, hat, scarf, rubber boots, socks, gloves
- hangers, hooks, or places to put away warm clothes
