A distemper-parvo vaccine clinic is coming up in Warm Springs from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. this Saturday, March 11. The clinic is free to tribal members who register.

Fences for Fido is the host of the event, with help from volunteers. This is the third and final clinic in a recent series on the reservation.

At the Saturday clinic, shots and boosters will be available. Young puppies need a series of three vaccines to be protected against parvo and distemper. The clinic is for pet owners who are reservation residents (no ID required). Bring any vet records you have for your dogs; or be prepared to let the Fences for Fido team know when the animal last had a vaccine.

Please keep your dogs in your car and on a leash. Dogs only, Sorry, no cats or kittens.
