UNIT:	CLOTHES UNIT	BY:	Pat Miller, Shirley Tufti, Alice Harman
LEVEL:	Beginning	FOR:	Home-Based Learning
LESSON:	Feltboard Clothes	TIME:	15 Minutes at a Time

GOAL:
For the students to learn the words and phrases for getting dressed.

OBJECTIVES: The student will be able to:

1. Follow directions to put clothes on feltboard people, for full control.
2. Say the words for items of everyday clothing, for partial control.
3. Follow directions to find, make, clean up, put away and throw away, for partial control.

PROCEDURES:

1. **Introduction:**
The teacher will put up a feltboard and put a person on. She will tell the class that we will all dress up the person.

2. **Implementation:**
Have the students work together in small groups. Give directions for each group to select an article of clothing and put it on the feltboard person.

Mu nano woiku.	You guys work together.
Ka natse kwasu tsakwummow.	Take the boy's shirt off.
Ka poohe tsotu'a mayuseoi oo haneku.	Find the blue hat and put it on the boy.

Making More Clothes

Give felt, scissors, and decorating supplies to the students. Have each team work together to make some more clothes for the feltboard boy.

Ya'a suzu, mu wanapu mu hee.	Here's the scissors, felt and stuff.
A koosa matapooe.	Make a pair of pants for him.

3. **Closure:**
Have the students clean up their supplies and put them away.

Pesa mitu kudena.	Clean everything up.
No'oko hemma mabe toonow.	Put everything away.
Eka wuniyool	Throw the scraps away!

4. **Follow-Up:**
Repeat this lesson from time to time, using different clothes and the clothes that the students have made.

Let the students take turns dressing the doll. Give them different commands. Ask them questions and let them give you one-word answers.

Túnam ashapatátpasisha?	What are you putting on her?
Túnam áchaq'w'shtikáisha?	What are you taking off?
Tun itátpasisha?	What is she wearing?

More Language to Use:

Depending on the kinds of clothing you have to dress the doll in, you may wish to use some of the following language:

áshapachai'mxwsha	to put a scarf on someone
áshapakapuwisha	to put a coat on someone
áshapaq'p'q'plisha	to put shoes on someone
áshapastknisha	to put stockings on someone
áshapataqmaatisha	to put a hat on someone
áshapawalachwichsha	to put a belt on someone
áshapaq'umisha	to put gloves or mittens on someone
áshapaútpsha	to put a shawl, blanket-robe, etc. on someone; put on something around someone else's shoulders
áshapakashtkaisha lapáwash	to tie someone else's shoelaces

3. **Closure:**
Tell the students to pick up the doll and the doll clothes and put them away.

Askauwíti t'aaxw táatpasna.	Pick up all the clothes.
Nichti t'aaxw táatpas.	Put the clothes away.
Anichti sap'aluxnak'a.	Put the doll away too.

4. **Follow-Up:**
Ask the students to bring their own dolls and doll clothes to the next class. Repeat this lesson using their own dolls and doll clothes.
