Carol Leone, former executive director of the Museum at Warm Springs, passed away on May 14.

Carol was the fifth museum executive director, serving from 2002 until 2018, and was the longest serving executive director in our museum’s 31-year history.

Carol had a long and distinguished museum career, which began in 1992 at the Museum of Northern Arizona, where she was first an intern, and then director of the museum’s Heritage Program. At that time she coordinated Native art markets with the Navajo, Hopi and Zuni, arranged internships for Native college students, and curated special exhibitions.

She said of the Musem at Warm Springs after her retirement: “The Museum is like a wonderful basket to keep these heirlooms we really need to preserve.”

In her retirement, Carol was a loyal member and donor to



The Museum at Warm Springs.

She broke the mold of what was expected of her and became a political activist, an advocate for equality, an artist, a practicing Buddhist, and an outspoken firecracker.

A lover of art, nature, and history, she combined these passions into a long-time career working in museums and the cultural anthropology world.

We will miss Carol very much and honor her for all of her contributions to our museum. Our hearts will always be with her family and all those who knew and loved her.
