

Addressing at-large dog issue

Warm Springs Tribal Council approved a temporary resolution authorizing the Police Department, Fire and Safety, Health and Human Services, and Emergency Management to address the issue of at-large and dangerous dogs in the community.

Regarding the issue, The Warm Springs Police De-

partment is requesting community support. The department made the following announcement:

To pet owners: Ensure your dogs are securely contained, properly vaccinated, and do not pose a risk to others.

Reporting: If you see an at-large or dangerous dog, report it immediately to the

Warm Springs Police Department or the appropriate agency.
