I’m a candidate running for a seat on Tribal Council as a Simnasho District Representative and I’m asking for your vote. I believe that any and all decisions made by the Council table will have a lasting impact on our tribe and our future generations. It would be an honor to have a seat at the Council table and I would do my best to make a difference for all tribal members, while keeping our Constitution and By-Laws and Sovereignty as top priorities.

I was raised here in Warm Springs by my mom, the late Rita ‘Patches’ Roybal Marchand. She is the daughter of Martha Henning of Warm Springs and Wilford Johns Sr. of Puyallup. My Great Grandparents are the late George Henning and Hattie Anderson.

I married Marcelene Stacona in November 2018.

My goals for my term in Council would be:

- Transparency throughout my term by having open conversations with members by holding quarterly meetings and bringing those conversations to the Souncil table when appropriate.
- See where we as a tribe can move forward with current and innovative endeavors that



include small business owners.

- Continue to seek out solutions that will provide reliable childcare for our tribal members and our employees.
- Maintain Senior Funding and provide seniors with the resources they need.
- Advocate and identify dollars for infrastructure improvements and any new possible business ventures for our tribes and its members.
- Be a frontrunner for increased youth support from birth to adulthood.
- Work to provide livable wages that will enhance job creations for tribal members.
- And most importantly, uphold our Treaty and Tribal Constitution and By-laws, and our Declaration of Sovereignty as written.

I currently am working as the tribes’ Health and Human Services General Manager. I’m a strong advocate for a drug- and alcohol-free community.

I’ve been a part of various com-

munity coalitions that include the Native Aspirations Coalition and the former Let’s Talk Diversity Coalition. I’m currently a member of the Warm Springs–Indian Health Service Joint Health Commission.

My professional interests focus on the well-being of the community, helping provide healthy alternative drug- and alcohol-free activities, and advocating for youth support in all aspects of health.

I’m a Certified Prevention Specialist in the Prevention field. I’ve also worked in various departments throughout the tribal organization that include Eerly Childhood Education, Warm Springs Utilities, and Fire Management.

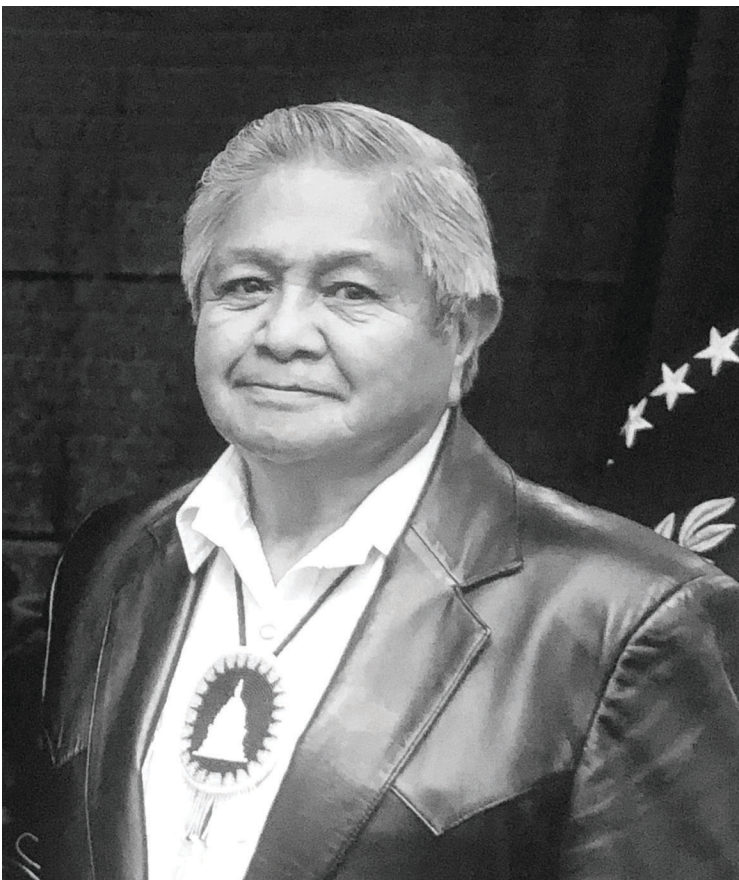
Outside of work I enjoy coaching and participating in multiple sports especially softball, golf, and basketball.

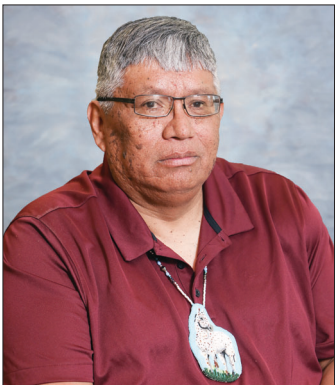
National Governance at the National Congress of the American Indian.
