UNIT:	CLOTHES UNIT	BY:	Pat Miller, Shirley Tufti, Alice Harman
LEVEL:	Beginning	FOR:	Home-Based Learning
LESSON:	How Many Clothes?	TIME:	15 Minutes at a Time

GOAL:

For the students to learn about counting items of clothing in Paiute.

OBJECTIVES: The student will be able to:

1. Say the numbers from 1-10, for partial control.
2. Count from 1-10 items of clothing, for partial control.
3. Follow directions to pick up between 1-10 items of clothing and give them to another person, for full control.
4. Ask and answer where certain numbers of clothing are, for partial control.

PROCEDURES:

1. Introduction:
The teacher will show several different hats to the students.

2. Implementation:
See, Listen and Say
The teacher will count the hats. The students can repeat the words for numbers.

Ya'a sumu'yoo tsotu'a.	This is one hat.
Ya'a pahe'yoo tsotu'a.	These are three hats.

Listen and Do
The teacher will give commands about different numbers of clothing to the students. The students will follow the commands.

Wahow moko hemmow.	Pick up two shoes.
Ooka hemmeoo.	Give them to him.

Ask and Answer
The teacher will ask students the following questions, and they will answer.

Hano'yoo ya'a?	How many are there?
Manege'yoo.	There are five.
Hano pahe'yoo nakwe?	Where are three dresses?
Umu o'o.	They're over there.

Numbers
Use the following numbers:

sumu'yoo	one
waha'yoo	two
pahe'yoo	three
watsukwe'yoo	four
manege'yoo	five
naapahe'yoo	six
natakwatsukwe'yoo	seven
namewatsukwe'yoo	eight
sumukadoo'oopu	nine
sumumano	ten

3. Closure:
Pass out items of clothing to students. Go around in a circle and have students say how many they have.
4. Follow-Up:
• Grab Bag Lesson

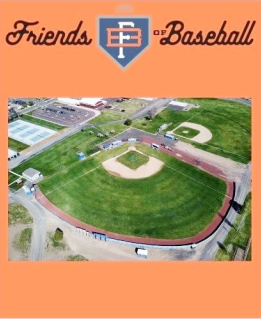
