PRCDA resolution – discussion with Michael Collins:

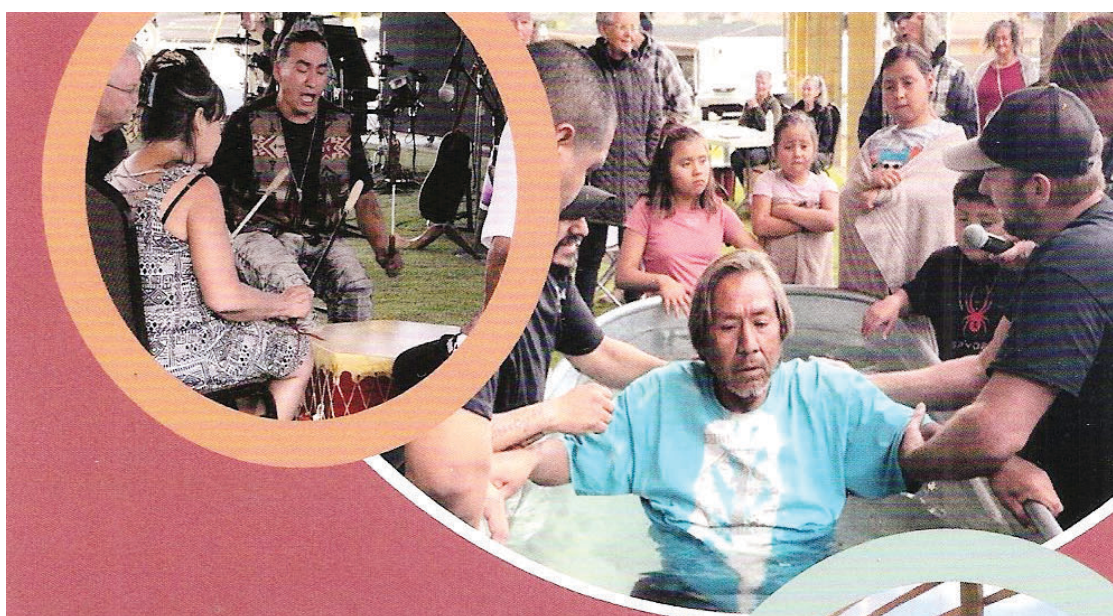
