PAIUTE LANGUAGE PROGRAM
LESSON PLAN

UNIT:	SONGS UNIT	BY:	Pat Miller, Alice Harman, Shirley Tufti
LEVEL:	Beginning	FOR:	Home-Based Learning
LESSON:	Learning a Song	TIME:	Two-Three Evenings

GOAL:
To enjoy learning to sing a Paiute song.

OBJECTIVES: The student will be able to:
 1. Sing a song in Paiute along with a tape, for full control.
 2. Understand and say the words in the song, for partial control.
 3. Understand and follow commands to listen, repeat, sing, say the words, for full control.

PROCEDURES:

1. Introduction:

Listen

Get a cassette tape or CD of the Paiute song you want to teach, put it in the tape player, and tell the students to listen to the song.

Ekea hoobea nakapunne.	Listen to this song.
Pudusoo tamme tunekwukwe.	We'll sing pretty soon.

2. Implementation:

Say

Listen and repeat the words and phrases in the song.

Tamme no'yoona meoo unekwe.	We will all say the words together.
Unusoo meo uni.	Say the words again.

Sing

Sing the song with the tape recorder. Practice several times. Have fun!

Tamme ekea hoobea nekwuhu.	We'll sing with this tape.
Mow, yise tamme tunikwu.	Now we'll all sing.

3. Closure:

Have the students listen to the song on their tapes at home. Give them a handout with the words to the song written on it. Or else write the words onto a white board and have them copy them into their notebooks.

4. Follow-Up:

Repeat this lesson from time to time until everyone knows the song. Have students draw and color a picture on their song handout that illustrates the message in the song.

RESOURCES:

- Song tape
- Handout with words to the song
- Tape recorder

EVALUATION:

The teachers will observe the students and keep a checklist of their accomplishments.
