The Warm Springs Campus Pavillion parking lot is now paved, as work is finishing up this week.

Health and Human Services finished the Pavillion structure two years ago; and after that the new water main and public restrooms went in.

Warm Springs Construction earlier prepared the parking lot area, awaiting a weather opportunity for paving, which happened last week into this week. The Pavillion is available for community use. Meanwhile on Campus, the Warm Springs Community Action Team food cart area is under construction on the corner lot across from the Pavillion. The food cart area is part of the overall WSCAT Commissary project.

Phase three will be renovation of the old Commissary itself, to become a small business incubator for local entrepreneurs.
