

Member & Youth Art Show in November



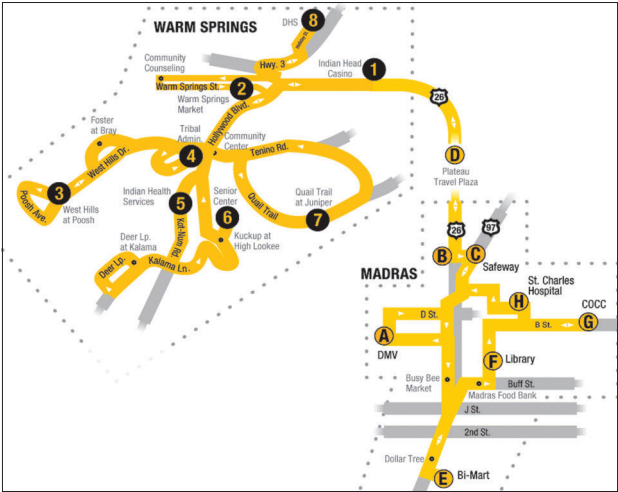

Cascades East Transit reinstating fares in January

In January bus riders in Central Oregon will start paying fares again. Cascades East Transit paused fares during the pandemic.

The Central Oregon Intergovernmental Council manages CET. COIC made the decision to bring the fares back. There will also be new ways for patrons to pay:

Riders will use a transit card or an app on their cell phone. CET's transit director says people will still be able to pay with cash in certain situations.



Last year ridership was the highest it's been since before the pandemic started. CET projects the move will bring in about \$1.5 million annually.
