### TRANSPORTATION

the driving while Candy was gone. Hazel will still be driving for part of each week.

NOTE: A new procedure for scheduling <u>all</u> rides where mileage is paid through county transportation funds will be implemented on October 15th. As of that date all rides, no matter WHO will be doing the driving, are to be scheduled thru the Tribal office, 879-5253. The reason, per the Transportation Manager for Polk County, is to avoid duplicated miles which has occurred by two cars going at the same time to the same destinations. Besides our Tribal Elderly Transportation Program there are local volunteers who perform transport services and are reimbursed with County funds. For future planning of transportation needs for the entire Grand Ronde area, each funding source must have statistical information showing the needs for transportation in this area. The only way both can be attained is through the cooperation of everyone.

There will be more information available as the plan is implemented.
