

TRIBAL STAFF:

The tribal council, and staff have been involved with Native American Program of Oregon Legal Services & the tribal consultants in the development of a management plan for the tribe.

Two workshops have been held at the tribal office in the past two weeks, and others are scheduled. Staff and the tribal consultants have almost completed the eighth month performance narrative required by the administration for Native American Grantors.

We have received a three month extension, this will extend our program from August 31, 1982, the original ending date, thru November 30, 1982.

We are in the process of submitting a three month work plan & a three month budget. In December 1982 we will enter into the second year continuation grant. Our '82, '83 budget will reflect \$75,000.00 rather than the original budget of \$60,000.00.

The Oiles Foundation provided funding for the greenhouse project that is producing benefits in the sales of vegetable plants. Several small markets have been identified, and sales made at these produce stands, and individuals.

The market is relatively small, at this time, as a major market is indentified, the project will expand to meet the demand, to provide the tribe with an income, and also to provide food for the needy in the Grand Ronde community.

A community garden is being implemented again this year thru a grant provided by the Lutheran Missouri Synod.

A food and craft shop will open very shortly on Hiway 18 at Grand Ronde. This is a tribal project. It was made available thru a grant from the National Indian Lutheran Board.
