

## TITLE IV,B

The Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde has submitted Proposals for two separate Indian Education Projects. These Projects are expected to be implemented during the 83-84 school year.

Project I, is a PILOT and DEMONSTRATION Project to be used as a Cultural Education Center during the summer and as an educational support program during the school year. The requested amount for operating the project is approximately \$36,000. If approved the program would provide about 6 jobs (part and full time), and would provide educational services to about 350 Indians within Polk and Yamhill Counties.

PROJECT II, is a Cultural heritage and Curriculum Development Project. The purpose of this project is to develop a FULL INDIAN curriculum concentrating on the histories and language of the Indians of the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde. Its design is primarily geared toward curriculum development but it also has an emphasis on instruction in the accepted language of Chinook Jargon as an official Indian language sanctioned by the Tribal Council. If this proposal is funded, there will be up to six positions which can be filled by Tribal members. The requested amount for funding this project is \$89,881.00. About half of the requested amount will go toward the purchase of equipment and supplies.

Both proposals, if funded, would replace the Title IV,A, Indian Education Project which was lost through administrative failures on the part of the school district. These two proposals were written after the loss of the Title IV,A.

## SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAM STARTED

Monday, June 28th, three participants of the Manpower Summer Youth Program began working at the Tribal grounds in Grand Ronde. Lydia Hosler & Paul Grippen are placed with the Agricultural Project and will assist with both the Greenhouse & the Tribe's Jam & Jelly venture. They are supervised by Frank Harrison. Angie Childers works for the Tribe as a Receptionist & is supervised by Jackie Colton. Angie and Lydia are members of the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde.
