CeCe will be available at the Tribal Office beginning June 21, 1983 and every Tuesday thereafter, to assist any Tribal Member who believes they have a 2415 Grand Rond Claim.

A S.B. 311 Hearing will be attented by Council members and staff on Thursday, June 23, 1983 at the State Capitol in Salem, Oregon. This Bill will create a seat for a representative of the Grand Rondes to the Commission on Indian Services beginning next year, January 1, 1983. Rep. Paul Hanneman amd Sen. Dell Isham of this Distict are supporting us 188% in this endeavor.
