

Administration's Report

The Indian Health Services contract which will place a Health Director, a Nurse, and a Nurses Aid, as a full time staff to deliver direct services to the six county area. Four more temporary full time staff will be placed for four months to complete a needs survey. The total contract amount is \$152,000.00.

The long awaited Reservation Plan Contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs is scheduled to be signed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs on August 20, 1984, for the first phase of the plan.

Staff is looking into the possibility of a Johnson O'Mally contract. This program is for youth who are in grades Kindergarten through 12. The Program is funded by the Bureau of Indian Affairs. Participants in the program must be one-fourth (1/4) blood or more, Indian. Johnson O'Mally provides tutorial services, cultural activities, special education activities; and parental costs, such as: tennis shoes, fees, musical instrument rental, and sports clothes. We are waiting to hear from the Bureau to see if there will be funds, and enough time to apply.
