East of Eden Timber Sold

The East of Eden Timber Sale sold on July 31, 1990 to Hampton Tree Farms, Inc. An estimated 3,861 board feet of Douglas-fir and other Conifer was purchased at the rate of \$389.55 per thousand board feet (MBF). A predetermined 135 MBF of Red Alder and other Hardwood was purchased at the total price of \$16,386.30.

The sale is located on the end of the Upper West Fork Road in Sections 16 and 17, T5S, R8W, W.M. This sale is comprised of two units totaling 61 acres scheduled to be clearcut harvested this summer (1991). The sale involved some minor road construction (0.61 miles) which has been completed by Braxling and Braxling Construction, with the exception of applying surface rock, which will occur this summer (1991). Zimbrick Logging, Inc. is expected to move in sometime this summer to commence cable logging operations.



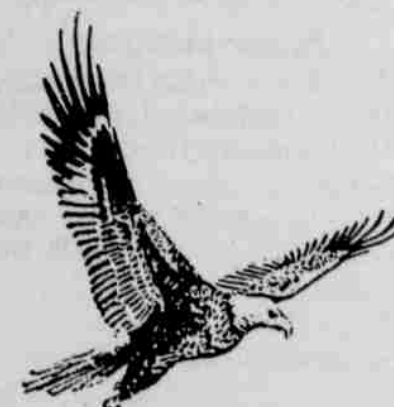
