Council Adopts Ordinances

On July 14 the Tribal Council adopted two new ordinances. The Small Claims ordinance was adopted and will go into affect August 20, 1993.

The Elder's Committee Ordinance was also adopted. Elder's committee nominations will take place on September 12 at the General Council Meeting. Elders who are tribal members will be the only people allowed to nominate committee members. The election will take place during the October General Council Meeting. Only Grand Ronde Tribal Elders with verified signatures on file will be allowed to vote.
