

Employees eager for new office space

The big, square building being completed near the Spirit Mountain is a lot of small buildings fixed together.

When it is finished it will be used to house training and education programs for the gaming operation of the Spirit Mountain Development Corporation.

The building was purchased from the Washington Public Power Sup-

ply System. The complex was moved from the huge Hanford nuclear reservation near Richland, Washington.

Mike Larsen, tribal facilities manager, said that the Tribe paid \$25,000 for the complex that includes 12 modular units. Each unit is 14 feet wide and 65 feet long. Six units are fastened together to make up one floor.

Cost of moving the units from Hanford to Grand Ronde totaled \$70,000.

Originally scheduled for occupancy in mid-March, Larsen said the project should be completed by the end of the month.

The building has over 10,500 square feet of floor space on two levels.



The new modular building will provide training facilities and office space for several tribal departments that have been expanding.

Deer, elk hunting season ends

The Grand Ronde Tribe seasons for taking deer and elk had mixed results. The first season opened Aug. 27, 1995 and the last one ended Feb. 28.

"The seasons this year were slightly better than last," Karen Larsen, the Natural Resources Department spokeswoman, said.

"We had more violations this year. A couple of them are serious infractions, that are still under investigation," she said.

No bear were taken during the hunting season.

- Bow Deer - three bucks, 1 doe.
- General Deer - 48 bucks.
- Bow Elk - one cow.
- First Season Elk - five bulls.
- Second Season Elk - three bulls.
- Control/Damage Doe - 10 bucks, 63 does.
- Trask Mt. - one bull.
- West Trask No. 1 - two cows.
- West Trask No. 2 - two cows.
- West Trask No. 3 - three cows.
- West Trask No. 4 - one cow.
- Mt. Richmond - three cows.
- Wind River - two cows.
- Beaver Creek - one cow.
- Upper Tualatin - one cow.
