KONAWAY NIKA TILLICUM

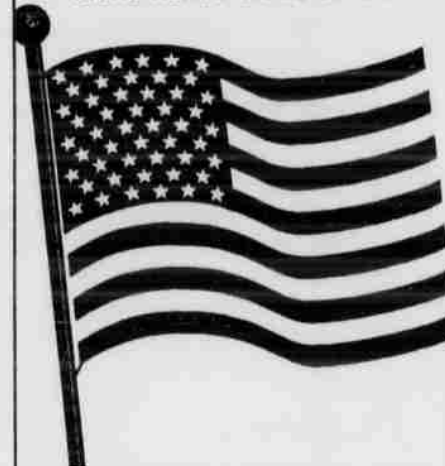
