

## Announcing education scholarships

Grand Ronde Tribal Education Trust Fund Scholarship applications are available at the Tribal Education Office for the 1997/98 academic year for **FULL-TIME** tribal member students:

**Eula Petite Memorial Scholarship (1):** Applicants must be seeking a degree in Education to teach Elementary, Secondary, Early Childhood or Special Education. Applicants must be currently enrolled students, must be at a Junior class standing, and must possess a cumulative Grade Point Average of a 2.75.

**Undergraduate Scholarship (3):** Applicants must be a high school graduate or possess a GED. Applicants must enroll in a four year degree program.

**Adult Vocational Training Program Scholarship (2):** Applicants must be a high school graduate or possess a GED diploma. Applicants would be pursuing a vocational or technical program of one to two year duration.

**Graduate Scholarship (1):** Applicants must possess a Bachelors Degree at time of application or prior to Fall Term/Semester entry of the year application is for.

The following scholarship applications are available for students who plan to attend **PART-TIME**. Applicants must provide explanation of why they can only pursue their program on a part-time basis, and will be required to enroll in credit hours for no less than 1/2 time status.

**Undergraduate Scholarship; part-time (3):** Applicants must possess a High School diploma or GED diploma.

**Adult Vocational Training Program Scholarship;**

**part-time (1):** Applicants must possess a High School diploma or a GED diploma.

**Graduate Scholarship; part-time (1):** Applicant must possess a Bachelors Degree at time of application or prior to Fall Term/Semester entry for the year application is for.

**DEADLINE TO SUBMIT A COMPLETED APPLICATION TO THE TRIBAL EDUCATION OFFICE IS APRIL 30, 1997.** Late applications will not be accepted! Please pick up your application early, as it does take a while to compile all the required information and documents. **OTHER SCHOLARSHIPS:** The Oregon State Scholarship Commission (OSSC) has numerous scholarships available to apply for that are both Private Awards and Selected Federal Program Awards. The application deadline to apply for the OSSC is **March 1, 1997**. Please call Marion at the Tribal Education Office for an application.

Cascade Policy Institute is offering scholarships to Oregon High School students. The **Third Annual Independence Essay Competition**, organized by Cascade, will award up to \$5,000 for the best essays on the Bill of Rights. Private, public and home schooled students are eligible to compete. To receive guidelines, call the Competition Hot-line at (503) 224-1737. The deadline to submit essays is **March 3, 1997**. The Independence Essay Competition is an opportunity for Oregon students to be recognized and rewarded on the basis of academic talent. ## ~ Grand Ronde Royalty Court Guidelines ~

If you or someone you know is interested in participating in Royalty Court for the upcoming year, now is the time to start thinking about it. Royalty Court is an excellent chance for young members to represent their Tribe with pride and dignity. It is an obligation which requires a lot of time and commitment, but it's also a tremendous honor. If this is something you would like to do, please fill out the application form provided and send it to the **new Royalty Court Advisor, Donna Casey, P.O. Box 901, Willamina, Oregon 97396.**

Participants must be an enrolled member of the Grand Ronde Tribe, enrolled in public or private school (unless graduated or a Tiny Tot) and in one of the following age categories: **Tiny Tot** — 0-5 years; **Honorary Court** — 6-10 years; **Jr. Miss Grand Ronde** — 11-14 years; **Sr. Miss Grand Ronde** — 15-19 years.

Participants must have their own regalia that is appropriate for all events. It is not the responsibility of the Pow-wow Committee, Royalty Committee, Tribal Council, or any other tribal program to provide these things for participants. There will be a list of scheduled events to attend. Part of the judging requirements will be to attend each event.

Members of Royalty Court are not paid positions. The two chosen Queens will receive a preset amount of travel money for attending required events. Fund-raisers are the responsibility of the Court and their parents/sponsors to coordinate. The monies raised will help the participants with travel expenses.

Royalty Court participants are expected by their conduct, to represent the Grand Ronde Tribe, their family, and themselves with integrity and gracious spirit at all times. This means that participants must show good judgement by not participating in any activities that could bring adverse publicity to themselves or the Tribe while a member of Royalty Court. Full dedication and preparation to represent the Tribe in a positive way is expected. Participants must be single, childless, and never married. All young women and girls participating must be drug and alcohol free.

Royalty Court participants and their parent/sponsor must attend all required events (pow-wows, parades, fund-raisers, organizational meetings and others). Absences can be prearranged with the Royalty Committee Advisor. Three unexcused absences will result in disqualification from Royalty Court. Please note that all participants receive 1 point for every event. Royalty Court participants are expected to stay for the duration of the events. This includes helping setup for events such as meetings and parades, as well as dancing during Grand Entry and staying until the flags are retired unless pre-approved with the Royalty Advisor. Participants are expected to speak in front of large groups of people. Royalty Court participants must be willing and able to dance. *Remember: You are all part of a team and are expected to treat yourselves, running mates, and others with respect at all times.*

Royalty Court participants will be judged at the Royalty Court Pageant during the Annual Pow-wow in August, 1997. Participants will be judged on speech, attendance at required events, interview questions, and raffle ticket sales. Participants are required to make at least one article of their regalia.

Participants must have a parent/sponsor who will accompany them to required events and help coordinate fund-raisers and related events. Any misconduct will result in disqualification from the Royalty Court.

Look for information regarding the first Royalty Court meeting, which is mandatory for all who wish to participate. The sooner you send in your application, the faster it can be processed. If you have any questions, please contact Donna Casey or Norma Billings at (503) 876-4663.
