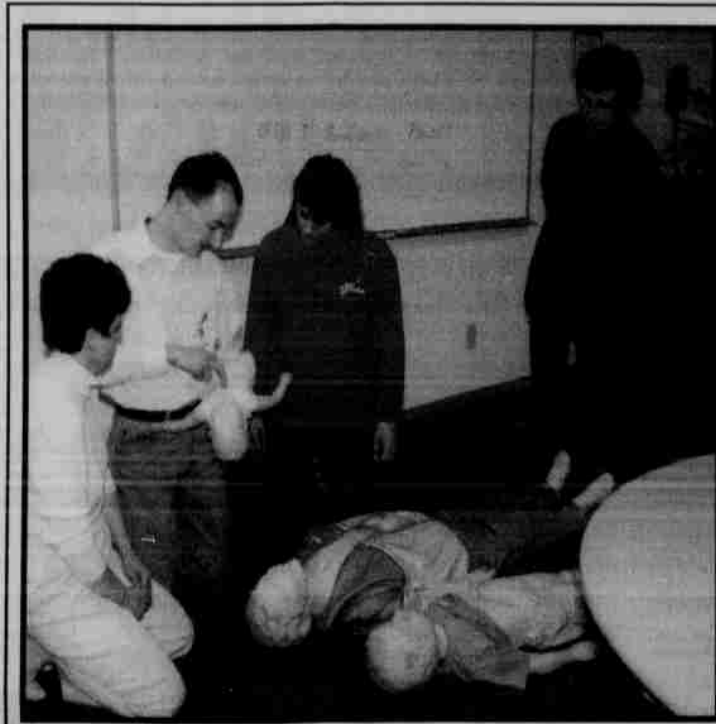

## Elder passes away

Marshall Glen Parazoo, a tribal Elder, 75, passed away on April 16 in Springfield, OR. Emphysema was the cause of his death.

He was born on April 2, 1923 in Sutherlin, Oregon to Henry and Ada Parazoo. Marshall married Carol Leeper on April 26, 1944.

Marshall worked in logging as a cat and yarder operator with K & W Logging. His favorite hobbies were fishing, hunting, camping and family get-togethers. He was a member of the Tribe, VFW Springfield Post 3965, and the Masonic Lodge. Marshall's military service included the U.S. Army, WWII, and Staff Sgt.

Survived by his wife, Carol Parazoo of Springfield; daughter, Glenda Davenport of Springfield; sons, Dan Parazoo of Bend, OR. and John Parazoo of McKenzie Bridge, OR.; five grandchildren; 3 great-grandchildren; and a sister, Hazel Pedersen of Eugene, OR.

A memorial service was held on April 20 at Springfield Memorial Gardens. Memorial contributions can be made to the Shriners Hospital for Children.
