A local basketball team is well into its second season competing in all-Indian tournaments as representatives of the Grand Ronde Tribe.



For the past year a few local Bballers have been taking the name of Grand Ronde to the hoop.

They have played in all-Indian B Division tournaments in Warm Springs, Salem, Wapito and Chiloquin as well as one mainstream competition in Portland.

Many are tribal members but their tribal affiliation also includes Winnebago, Wind River Shoshone, Colville and Yakama. At all-Indian basketball tournaments, however, they are the guys from Grand Ronde.

"It's kind of neat, we're from different tribes but we all go as Grand Ronde," says point and forward guard, Greg Leno. "It's really almost kind of like a tribal team."
