Proposed Public Safety Ordinance

The Tribal Council, in consultation with the Tribal Attorney's Office, has proposed adoption of a Public Safety Ordinance to set forth procedures to control public nuisances on Tribal lands. Among other things, the Ordinance does the following:

- Prohibits persons from creating nuisances.
- Establishes noise and traffic standards.
- Sets forth requirements for the handling of animals.
- Establishes monetary penalties for violations of the Ordinance.
- Authorizes the Executive Officer to enforce the requirements of the Ordinance, including issuing orders to abate nuisances.

The first reading of the proposed Public Safety Ordinance was presented at the August 8, 2001 Tribal Council meeting.
