Board Positions

Chemawa Indian School, Salem, Oregon, an off-reservation boarding high school, grades 9-12, operated by the U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs, is currently in the process of accepting nominations and appointing two new school board members from the States of Oregon and Washington.

The Chemawa School Board consists of five members, one each from the following states: Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington and one member at-large. Indian parents or legal guardians of students enrolled in the Chemawa Indian School are encouraged to seek appointment on the Chemawa Indian School Board.

Board members will be appointed for a term of three years. All board members' terms of office will commence on September 1, and expire on August 31, or at such later time, as their successor shall be appointed.
