Free Masters' Degree In Teaching At Morgan State University

Morgan State University is recruiting for the Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.) Program. This program is TUITION FREE and GUARANTEES EMPLOYMENT during and after the program for those who qualify. You must have a Bachelors' Degree in Art, Biology, Chemistry, English, History, Mathematics, Music or Physics, cumulative GPA of 3.0 for all undergraduate work, take the Miller Analogies Test and obtain three letters of recommendation.
