CHEMEKETA PLACEMENT TEST

If you are a new student pursuing a degree or certificate, you will be asked to take a free placement test (ASSET) in order to be accepted for admission. Test results more than five years old are not valid. The purpose of the test is to determine your skill levels in reading, writing and mathematics so you can select the entry-level classes that are right for you.
