JOB OPPORTUNITIES

The Natural Resources Department of The Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde, in cooperation with Oregon Youth Conservation Corps, seeks two youth crew leaders and 14 youth crew members for its Summer Youth Crew program. These positions are designed and funded for the purpose of providing enhanced opportunities for youth and/or students.

Youth Crew Leader/ F&W Intern

\$10.50-\$13.00/hour. Monday-Friday, 8-4:30

Approximately 14 weeks, starting June 11, 2004 (flexible)

Duties: Supervise and provide leadership to a seven-person summer youth work crew for eight weeks and assist the Fish and Wildlife Department for four to six weeks. Projects may include stream and riparian restoration/enhancement, trail and park maintenance and construction, native vegetation plantings, habitat enhancement monitoring, and other natural resource and community projects.

Qualifications: Desire to work with youth and in natural resources. Must be in good physical condition and be able to work in rugged outdoor terrain. Experience in the proper use of hand tools. Good communication skills.

Requirements: Work boots, valid Oregon Driver's License, safe driving record. Must successfully complete pre-employment background check and drug test.

Youth Crew Member

Approximately 8 weeks, starting July 1, 2004

Duties: Work as a member of a seven-person summer youth work crew. Youth crew projects may include stream restoration/enhancement, trail and park maintenance, native tree plantings, forest inventory work, or other natural resource and community projects.

Qualifications: Must be 16-19 years of age. Must have the ability or experience to safely and properly use hand tools. Must be in good physical condition and be able to work in rugged outdoor terrain. Interest or experience in natural resources related work helpful.

Requirements: Furnish their own work boots and successfully complete pre-employment background check and drug test.

Closing date: Friday, June 11, 2004.

- This is YOUR chance to be a part of making our children's lives better!
- The Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde Community of Oregon is beginning it's own Tribal Member Review Board to periodically review the cases of Tribal children who are in Tribal custody and have often been placed out of their homes.
- In the review meetings the Board will review files and reports, and will be able to ask questions of the Indian Child Welfare Program caseworkers in charge of the case. Often the Board members will also listen to the parents, the children (if old enough), the foster parents, lawyers, and others concerned with the case.
- The Review Board members will then decide whether or not the planning for the children is in their best interests, and will make recommendations to the Program, the parents and caretakers, and to the Judge.

PROPOSED PUBLIC SAFETY ORDINANCE AMENDMENTS

The Tribal Council, in consultation with the Tribal Attorney's Office, has proposed amendments to the Public Safety Ordinance. The first reading of the proposed amendments was made at the April 21, 2004, Tribal Council Meeting.

The purpose of the amendments is to address issues that routinely arise regarding use of Tribal Lands for campaigning activities, such as signs, distributing campaign materials, emails, etc., and public demonstration activities, such as protests and pickets. The proposed amendments provide instruction on permissible campaigning and public demonstration activities on Tribal Lands to ensure such activities are done in a manner which protects the peace, health, safety, welfare, and economic security of residents and visitors to Tribal Lands. The proposed amendments include, but are not limited to, the following:

Establish a policy on campaigning activities on Tribal Lands and provide that it is a violation of the Public Safety Ordinance to do any of the following activities regarding campaigning: (1) solicit or distribute campaign materials or petitions on Tribal Lands used for commercial or governmental purposes during normal business hours, with the exception of any government sponsored candidate forum or during the annual pow-wow; (2) use Tribal resources, including equipment such as telephones, voicemail, e-mail, fax machines, computers and printers to solicit or distribute campaign materials or petitions; (3) erect or maintain a political sign on Tribal Lands used for governmental or commercial purposes, or the common areas of Tribal Lands used for residential purposes; (4) erect or maintain a political sign on Tribal Lands used for residential purposes without the permission of the occupant of the premises on which the sign is located; (5) erect or maintain a political sign on Tribal Lands used for residential purposes earlier than the date of nominations for Tribal Council and later than ten days after the election.

Establish a policy on public demonstration activities on Tribal Lands which includes a permit requirement and the designation of a public demonstration area and provide that it is a violation of the Public Safety Ordinance to engage in activities that block or interfere with traffic or access to Tribal buildings, that harass Tribal Representatives or visitors, incite violence, or threaten or cause physical harm to any person or property.
