ARTISTS WITHOUT BARRIERS

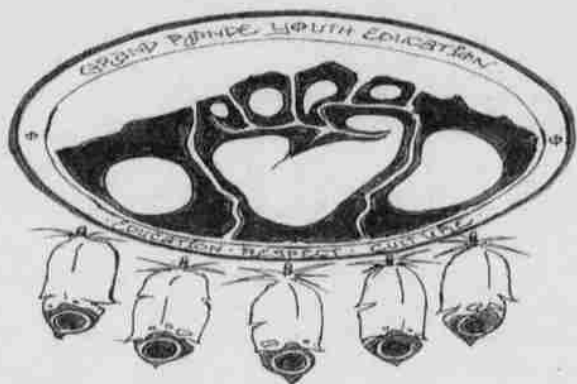
