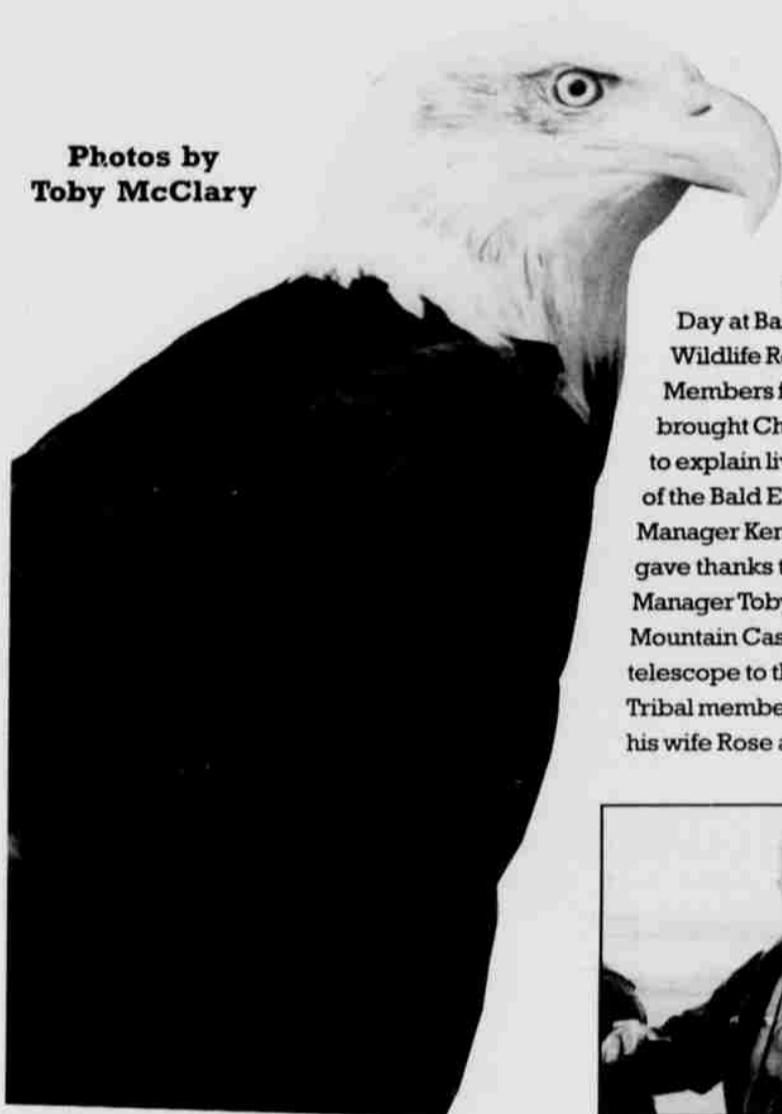


Bald Eagles Explained, Blessed

Tribe's New Elder Foster Care Facility Dedicated With Ceremony

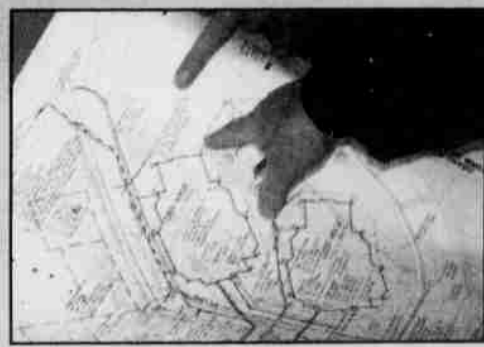
- ▼ Tribal Council members (below) break ground for the new Elder Foster Housing facilities.
