OPPORTUNITY FOR COMMENT ON GRTHA'S PERFORMANCE UNDER ITS INDIAN HOUSING PLAN
 The Grand Ronde Tribal Housing Authority (GRTHA) has received grants under the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act of 1996. HUD will provide grants to Indian Tribes and Indian Housing Authorities for the development and operation of low-income housing in Indian areas. To be eligible for the grants, the Housing Authority must submit an Indian Housing Plan that meets the minimum requirements of the Act, and submit performance reports to HUD.

Tribal members are hereby notified that the Housing Authority has prepared its Annual Performance Report, and comments on it are welcome. All comments will be incorporated into the final report.

NWIHA Scholarship For Tribal Youth

The Northwest Indian Housing Association (NWIHA) annually provides scholarships to Tribal youth, defined as Tribal members ages 24 years old, or younger. The intent is to provide financial awards to youth for education and training programs at schools, colleges, job training organizations, or other worthwhile organizations. Traditionally individual awards have not exceeded \$1,000.

TIMBER SALES ON THE GRAND RONDE RESERVATION

Two sales of Tribally-owned timber on the Grand Ronde Reservation will be available for public bid:

Eadcalla Thin Logging Unit, located in S.E. ¼ Section 3, S.E. ¼ Section 7, S.W. ¼ Section 8, N.E. ¼ Section 10, and N.W. ¼ Section 17, Township 5S., Range 8W., Willamette Meridian, Yamhill County, Oregon. This Logging Unit contains approximately 121.3 acres to be commercially thinned with a timber volume of approximately 2447 MBF sawlogs of all species. This consists of an estimated volume of 2447 MBF of Douglas-fir and Other Conifers — Peeler and Sawmill Grade Logs at a minimum bid rate of \$402.67 per thousand board feet net scale, and All Conifer Species — Wood Logs and Other Wood Products at the predetermined rate of \$57.32 per thousand board feet gross scale or \$8.72 per ton. Red Alder and Other Hardwoods — Peeler and Sawmill Grade Logs, Wood Logs and Other Wood Products may be offered at the predetermined rate of \$459.71 per thousand board feet net scale.

West Fork Logging Unit, located in N.E. ¼ Section 7, and W. 1/2 Section 8, Township 5S., Range 8 W., Willamette Meridian, Yamhill County, Oregon. This Logging Unit contains approximately 15.7 acres to be cut with a timber volume of approximately 828 MBF sawlogs of all species. This consists of an estimated volume of 712 MBF of Douglas-fir and Other Conifers - Peeler and Sawmill Grade Logs at a minimum bid rate of \$478.92 per thousand board feet net scale, an estimated volume of 116 MBF of Red Alder and Other Hardwoods — Peeler and Sawmill Grade Logs, Wood Logs and Other Wood Products at a minimum bid rate of \$393.11 and All Conifer Species — Wood Logs and Other Wood Products at the predetermined rate of \$67.49 per thousand board feet gross scale or \$10.27 per ton.

The above stated volumes are estimates and are not guaranteed. Bid opening for both sales will take place at the Grand Ronde Tribes' Natural Resources Facility, 47010 S.W. Hebo Road, Grand Ronde, Oregon, at 2 p.m., local time, on **Tuesday, March 15, 2005**. Leonard LaVerne Quenelle

July 4, 1935 - February 2, 2005

Leonard "Chuck" or "Woodchuck" LaVerne Quenelle of Salem passed away February 2 in Salem. He was 69.

He was born in Old Grand Ronde to Leonard and Lizzette Warren Quenelle.

He lived in Grand Ronde, Dallas and Salem. He served in the Air Force during the Korean War. He worked as a logger for the Long Bell Logging Company.

On March 14, 1996 he married Ida Mae Bratton in Grand Ronde.

He loved to draw, tell stories, dance at powwows, any kind of social gathering and spending time with his family. He was proud of his Indian heritage and was very patriotic. He loved people and was very generous. He enjoyed hunting and fishing.

He was preceded in death by sisters, Charlotte Quenelle, Delores Ream and Ilene Grammar.

Survivors include his wife, Ida of Salem; sons, Alan Jackson, Dareld Summers of Cloverdale and Bill Summers Jr. of Salem; sisters, Carol Quenelle of Siletz and Evelyn Quenelle of Jefferson; brothers, Donald of Vancouver, Wash., and Larry of Salem; six grandchildren; one great-grandchild; and two great-great-grand-children.

Services were February 7 at the Tribal Cemetery.

Grand Ronde Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program

The Grand Ronde Tribe has obtained a LIHEAP to assist income eligible Tribal members with energy emergencies and weatherization. The Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is an annual grant from the Division of Energy Assistance within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Four Tribes in Oregon operate this program and must serve all income eligible Indians on their Reservation or trust lands. Outside of these lands, but within the Tribes service area, Tribes can only serve households with adult members of their own Tribe. For LIHEAP, the Grand Ronde Tribes service area is the Tribe's typical six-county service area (Polk, Yamhill, Marion, Multnomah, Washington and Tillamook counties) plus Clackamas County. Tribal members in these counties must contact Grand Ronde to receive assistance, instead not the community action agency in their area. The Tribal program will allow more Tribal members to be assisted than would otherwise be possible.



There has been a great need for energy assistance especially for weatherization. For income eligible households the program can provide energy assistance (utility bills, fire wood, etc.), crisis energy assistance and weatherization (e.g. furnace repair).
