YOUTH JOB OPPORTUNITIES

The Natural Resources Department of The Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde, in cooperation with Oregon Youth Conservation Corps, seeks two youth crew leaders and 14 youth crew members for its Summer Youth Crew program. These positions are designed and funded for the purpose of providing enhanced opportunities for youth and/or students.

Youth Crew Leader/ F & W Intern

\$10.50-\$13.00/hour. Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

Approximately 14 weeks, starting June 10, 2005 (flexible)

Duties: Supervise and provide leadership to a seven-person summer youth work crew for eight weeks and assist the Fish and Wildlife Department for four to six weeks. Projects may include stream and riparian restoration/enhancement, trail and park maintenance and construction, Native vegetation plantings, habitat enhancement monitoring, and other natural resource and community projects.

Qualifications: Desire to work with youth and in natural resources. Must be in good physical condition and be able to work in rugged outdoor terrain. Experience in the proper use of hand tools. Good communication skills

Requirements: Work boots, valid driver's license, safe driving record. Must successfully complete pre-employment background check and drug test.
