**Grand Ronde Tribal Library**

The Grand Ronde Tribal Library is located in the Education Building. Library hours are as follows:

- Monday - Wednesday 8 a.m. - Noon and 1 - 8:30 p.m.
- Thursday & Friday 8 a.m. - Noon and 1 - 5 p.m.
- Saturday 10 a.m. - 2 p.m.

The library collection contains over 3,000 items that include fiction and non-fiction for youth and adults, a significant Native American collection, a wonderful collection of children's books in excess of 100 items, a limited collection of books on tape, a donated video collection of new and old movies and an impressive reference section with all updated materials.

An activity program for youth is held each fourth Saturday of the month for Kindergarten to 5th graders from noon - 2 p.m. An Adult Book Club meets on the second Saturday of the month from Noon - 2 p.m. and on the fourth Monday from 5:30 - 7 p.m. The book club members are reading Mystery books the past two months and have discussion & comment sessions.
