

October Is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month

October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month with Friday, October 21 being National Mammography Day. Prevention is key to maintaining your health and wellness. Mammograms save lives by finding breast cancer early, when it is easier to treat. Breast cancer screening has been shown to reduce breast cancer mortality. A mammogram can show cancer that is too small for you or your doctor to feel. The American Cancer Society's Cancer Facts and Figures for 2005 states that 63 percent of breast cancers are diagnosed at the localized stage. When diagnosed at the localized stage, the 5-year survival rate is 97.5 percent.

The National Cancer Institute recommends that women 40 and over get a mammogram every 1-2 years. Women at increased risk, such as those who have a family history of cancer, a genetic tendency or a previous cancer should talk to their physicians about the appropriate screening schedule for them.

The Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde will host another Tribal Member Community Meeting regarding the Master Plan for the future Cultural Center and Museum. Jones & Jones Architects will present several concept design options for the new facility. An open discussion will follow the presentation to gather comments and input from the community.

The previous Community Meeting on September 27 was a success and gave the project team valuable insight from the Grand Ronde community. Ideas and thoughts from you as Tribal Members are essential to help create a Cultural Center and Museum which truly represents your past, present and future.

The primary funding for this master plan project was provided by a grant from the Administration for Native Americans.





Timber Sale Auction On The Grand Ronde Reservation

The "Coast Thin Logging Unit", located in SE ¼ and W ¼ Section 6 and N ¼ Section 7, Township 5S, Range 7W, Willamette Meridian, on the Grand Ronde Indian Reservation in Yamhill County, Oregon will be open for public bid. This logging unit contains approximately 61.8 acres to be thinned and 16.9 acres to be clearcut harvested. The timber consists of an estimated volume of 2,131,000 board feet of Douglas-fir and Other Conifers — Peeler and Sawmill Grade Logs to be auctioned at a minimum bid rate of \$407.35 per thousand board feet net scale. Red Alder and Other Hardwoods — Peeler and Sawmill Grade Logs may be sold at the predetermined rate of \$474.15 per thousand board feet net scale; All Conifer Species — Wood Logs and Other Wood Products may be sold at the predetermined rate of \$58.10 per thousand board feet gross scale or \$8.84 per ton, as applicable. The stated volumes for the above timber sale are estimates and are not guaranteed. Bid opening will take place at the Grand Ronde Natural Resources Office located at 47010 S.W. Hebo Road, Grand Ronde, Oregon, at 2 p.m., Local Time, on Tuesday, October 25, 2005. The Petitioner, Marcella Johns Colson, on behalf of the Applicant, Tyler Michelle Hudson, a minor child, has petitioned the Court for a Change of Name for the minor child. Applicant allegedly desires to change his or her name to Tyler Michelle Johns, for the following stated reasons: Applicant, through regular use, has become known by the proposed name; Applicant's last name differs from the last name of the parent or guardian and she wishes to assume the last name of the parent or guardian.

Based on the foregoing petition filed with the Court on September 30, 2005, and good cause appearing therefore, **IT IS ORDERED THAT** the petitioner and any person objecting to the granting of the petition shall appear in the Tribal Court of the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde Community of Oregon, located at 9615 Grand Ronde Road, Grand Ronde, Oregon on November 16, 2005 at 9:30 a.m. to show cause why the Court should not enter judgment granting the proposed change of name.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any written response to this Order by any party to this case shall be filed on or before November 9, 2005.

The Clerk of the Tribal Court shall cause a copy of this Order to be served upon all parties in accordance with Rule 14 of the Rules of Pleading, Practice and Procedure of the Tribal Court of the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde Community of Oregon and file proof of service with the Court on or before the date set for hearing in this matter.
