Native Author Exhibit: 50 Library Patrons have visited the Native Author Exhibit that is on display in the Library August 18 — September 30, 2005. 45 Native American author works are represented in the exhibit.

Collection Additions: 111 Books and non-print items have been added to the Library Collection during the month of September. Another 100 items have been purchased or donated and will be added to the collection once cataloged. Added items include the following:

The Tribal Library welcomes suggestions and recommendations from the library patrons for new additions to the library collection.

Donations are welcomed at the library. Our appreciation goes to Rusty Leno, Leslie Riggs, Bob Tom, Chris Mercier, Barbara, Nancy Renfrow, Margo Mercier and Joseph Ham for the wonderful donations they made to the library collection this month.

In 17 days of service at the library in September there were 235 patron visits; 416 circulations, 132 donations and 54 computer sign-ins. 18 new library cards were issued. The library-sponsored Discover Native Oregon workshop was attended by 15 participants; the Early Literacy Training was attended by six participants and the children and youth story time/library sessions were attended by 60 participants.

American Indian Services Scholarship

Qualified students are eligible for up to one half of tuition, with a minimum of \$500 and a maximum of \$1,500. Applicants must be enrolled full or part time as an undergraduate at a college, university, or technical school; have less than 150 semester or 210 quarter credit hours; a minimum 2.25 GPA and be at least 1/4 Native American. Application deadline is November 15 for classes starting in January. 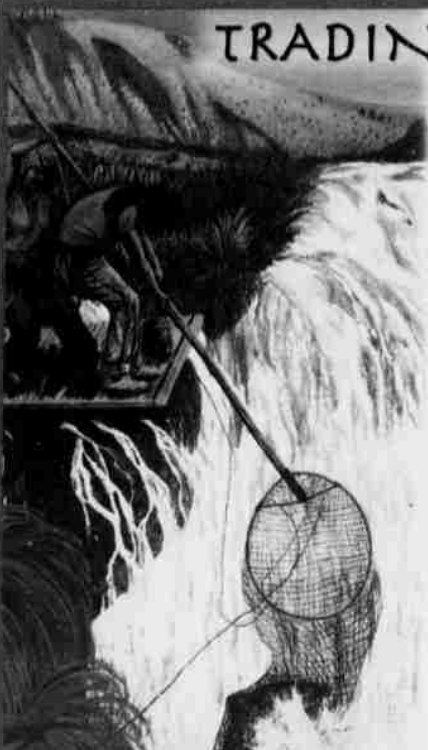
