Forrest Dale Bahler died in Portland, Oregon at the age of 70. He was born May 26, 1935 in North Bend, Oregon to Dorris and Viola (Taylor) Bahler. Forrest graduated from Siletz High School in 1954 and joined the U.S. Navy, serving in Korea. He participated in the atomic testing in the Marshall Islands. He was transferred to the Reserves in 1958. IN 1981 Forrest joined the Disabled American Veterans in Salem. He served as Chapter Commander for 4 years at the State Convention and he was awarded Commander of the year 1992-1993 and 2001-2002 and at the Veterans' Day Banquet he received the Veteran of the Year Award. He was honored in the Veterans' Parade in Albany. In 2003, he also served as State Commander and was honored to serve his fellow Veterans with compassion and dedication. His love and respect for them was reflected in his hard work. Forrest worked at Willamette Industries in Dallas for 26 years. Forrest and Connie were married October 7, 1988 in Dallas. He was a member of the Disable American Veterans, VFW, Am Vets and the Elks. He enjoyed wood-working, guns, hunting, fishing and fundraising for local Veterans. Forrest will long remember as a father, grand father, brother, uncle and devoted husband to Connie. He was lovingly referred to as "Papa Fish" or "Orey" to many.

Forrest is survived by his wife, Connie; sons; Greg and Marck; daughters, Mona, Debbie and Colleen; stepchildren, Calvin, John and Vickie; brother; Ray; sister, Sharon; ten grandchildren; 2 great-grandchildren, 16 step grandchildren; and 4 step great grandchildren.

NOTICE TO GENERAL CONTRACTORS

Grand Ronde Tribal Housing Authority (Authority) in Grand Ronde, Oregon is located 33 miles west of Salem, Oregon. This is a request for Design/Build Bid. General Contractors (GC) responses to this request will be used to identify the most qualified contractors to negotiate a contract.

The Project is to design and construct a Membrane Bioreactor Equipment (MBR) sewage treatment plant in necessary phases to process a future sewage design flow of 250,000 gpd meeting the parameters discussed in the SOQ/P packet. This will be on site of approximately 0.5 acre located on a 20-acre parcel in the Grand Ronde community situated within Polk County. The project will be for the development of a sewer treatment facility for a family housing campus using Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde (Tribal) funds.

GC's wishing to be considered must request a Qualification Packet as provided by the Authority and respond to the requirements put forth therein. Phone 503-879-2401 to request a Qualification Packet.

Qualification Packets must include the completed Qualification Statement, list of the primary team members, the answers to the specific project questions, and letter from the Bonding Company.
