Willamina School District Title VII Indian Education program is recruiting Parents and/or Guardians to serve as members on the Title VII Native Advisory Board. Elections will be held to fill the following seats:

- ◆ Three parents/guardians Native American/Alaska Native students
- ◆ One Native Amer./Alaska Native student 7th - 12th grade (one-year term)

The Title VII Native Advisory Board is made up of volunteer citizens who are interested in improving education for American Indian and Alaska Native students. Board members are committed to the purpose and goals of the Title VII Indian Education Program and must be able to attend meetings on a regular basis and commit to increased NAB communication with the community.

The Title VII Native Advisory Board meets on the third Thursday of each month September through May, with additional meetings as needed. Monthly time requirement of members is approximately 3-6 hours.

Nominations and elections will be held during a Public Meeting on Monday, August 7 at the Tribal Adult Education Building, Room 126. All parents, guardians and teachers of American Indian and Alaska Native students in the Willamina or Sheridan School District are welcome and encouraged to attend this meeting and elect and vote on the candidates.
