PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE
GOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS ORDINANCE

The Tribal Council, in consultation with the Tribal Attorney's Office, has proposed amendments to the Governmental Relations Ordinance. The first reading of the proposed amendments was made at the July 12, 2006, Tribal Council Meeting.

The purpose of the proposed amendments is to update the Ordinance to reflect the establishment of the Public Affairs Office and the Public Affairs Director position. The proposed amendments also replace references to the Executive Officer with Public Affairs Director as the individual to assist Tribal Council with public relations and intergovernmental communication.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE GENERAL
COMMITTEE AND SPECIAL EVENT BOARD ORDINANCE

The Tribal Council, in consultation with the Tribal Attorney's Office, has proposed amendments to the General Committee and Special Event Board Ordinance. The first reading of the proposed amendments was made at the July 12, 2006, Tribal Council Meeting.

The purpose of the proposed amendments is to improve the Ordinance by clarifying provisions pertaining to the role of committees, membership requirements, reporting requirements, duties of officers, and requirements for financial transactions.

The proposed amendments include the following: (1) clarification of the role of committees; (2) exception for membership on an ad-hoc committee or board from the limitation that an individual may not serve as a voting member on more than two committees or boards at a time; (3) prohibition of persons with certain felony convictions from serving on a committee or board; (4) clarification that committees and boards shall make a report to General Council on an annual basis; (5) clarification of the duties of the office of vice-chairman; and (6) clarification of documentation requirements for financial transactions.

PROPOSED ELECTION ORDINANCE AMENDMENTS

The Tribal Council, in consultation with the Tribal Attorney's Office, has proposed amendments to the Election Ordinance. The first reading of the proposed amendments was made at the August 9, 2006, Tribal Council Meeting.

The purpose of the amendments is to improve the Tribe's election process. The proposed amendments include, but are not limited to, the following requirements:

- ◆ Election Board must staff the office a minimum of 20 hours per week between nominations and the election
- ◆ Election Board must publish and post office hours
- ◆ Election Administrator must mail a Signature Verification Form to each voter who does not have a Signature Verification Form on file with the Board at least 30 days prior to nominations
- ◆ Election Board must send a post card confirming that a voter has been added to the poll book
- ◆ The Voters Address List must indicate which voters have a Signature Verification Form on file with the Board
- ◆ Election Administrator must update and distribute the Voters Address List to all candidates 30 days before the election.

2. Tribal member spouses, parents and/or legal guardians of Grand Ronde Tribal member children
3. Current regular employees
