If you are an out-of-state student who is a member of an Oregon Tribe or a Tribe that had traditional and customary boundaries in Oregon, you are eligible for in-state tuition at any of the Oregon University System schools. This ruling acknowledges some California, Idaho, Nevada and Washington Tribes, as well as the Modoc Tribe of Oklahoma.
