A Pre-College Workshop for Native American Students

Eligibility: Native American (enrolled members only), Alaska Native or Native Hawaiian — current sophomores and juniors in high school with a minimum GPA of 3.0 (in academic courses) required.

June 16-20, 2007 – Harvard University, Cambridge, MA
June 23-27, 2007 – Stanford University, Palo Alto, CA

College Horizons is a five-day "crash course" in preparing for college. Expert college counselors will team up with college admission officers to help you:

- Select colleges suitable for you
- Complete winning applications and write memorable essays
- Learn what turns an applicant into an admitted student
- Become a test-prep "whiz kid"
- Find your way through the financial aid/scholarship jungle

Applications will be accepted on a space-available basis until May 1 — program cost is \$150 (includes tuition, room, meals, all materials, and transportation to campus from the Boston, San Francisco, or San Jose airports). Students are responsible for their own airfare, but substantial funds are available for travel and tuition assistance (each year more than 50% of students are awarded).
