### Head Start Fishing Trip

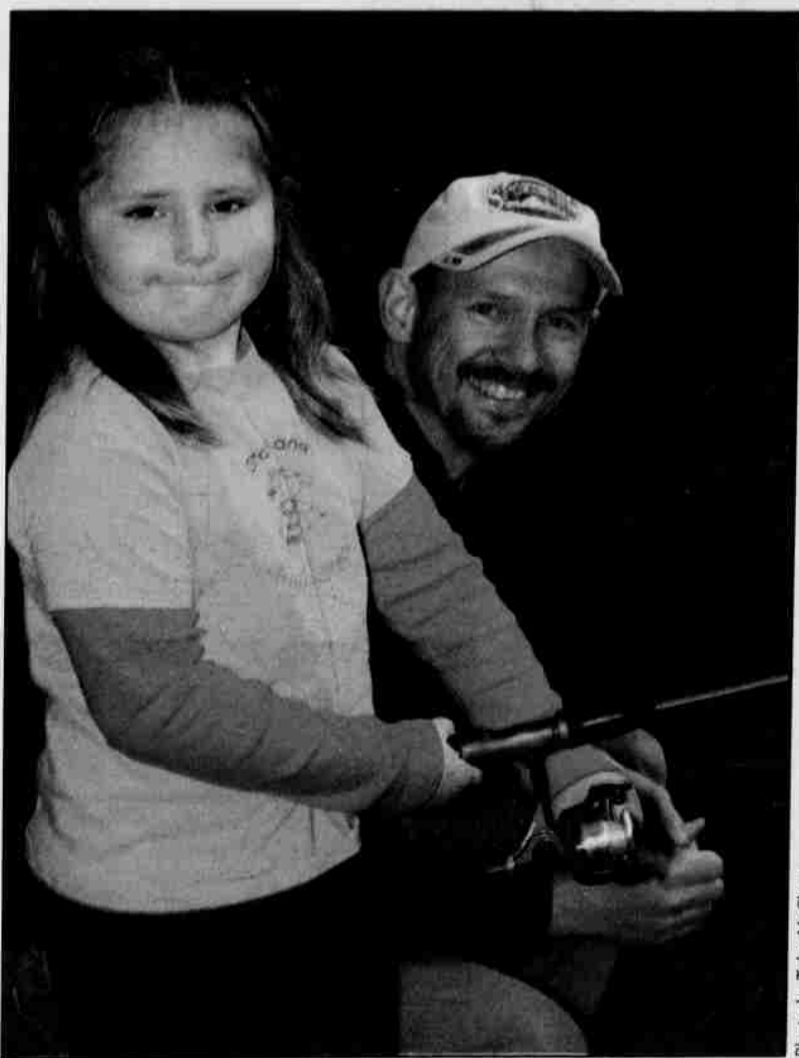
