Tribe Will Gather at Champoege State Park for National Indian Day Celebration

The Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde, Friends of Historic Champoege and Oregon Parks and Recreation Department are hosting a celebration of National Indian Day from 3 to 7 p.m. Friday, Sept. 28, at Champoege State Heritage Area near St. Paul.

The event will feature the Grand Ronde Honor Guard, ceremonial drumming and dancing, cultural craft demonstrations, historical Tribal information, and speeches from Tribal leaders. Tribal and community members are encouraged to attend.

Champoege has always been a gathering place for the Kalapuyan Tribe and other peoples during its long and rich history. The name comes from the Kalapuyan word, which roughly translates as "place to gather; good things to eat."

The public is invited to attend and join in the celebrations to commemorate the connection of the Kalapuyan and other Tribes of the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde to Champoege.

A \$3 per vehicle parking fee is charged to the public; however, the fee is waived for Grand Ronde Tribal members. Mention that you are a Grand Ronde Tribal member at the park entrance booth.

Champoege State Park is at 8239 Champoege Road N.E., St. Paul.
