American University — American Indian Washington Internships for Native Students (WINS) program:

This program is designed for American Indian and Alaska Native students to intern and study in Washington, D.C., for the semester or the summer. Students work 35-40 hours a week in a federal agency which sponsors American Indian and Alaska Native students from across the country and develops leadership skills.

Students may receive transportation to and from Washington, D.C., tuition and books, stipend for incidentals and local transportation, housing at American University's Tenley Campus dormitories, meal plan and an internship in the capital.

eBay Training Workshop in Grand Ronde

Interested in learning how to buy and sell items on eBay? You can use eBay and the Internet to make money and/or purchase gifts during the holiday season.

The Noncredit Program will be hosting an eBay training course in the Adult Education Computer lab on Saturday, Nov. 3. This course will cover many topics, including: registering and creating a seller's account, product selection, prohibited items, fees, listing preparation, proper item title and descriptions, taking professional photos, pricing considerations and "how to's", selling formats, item selection and research, selecting payment methods and PayPal, shipping options, shipping calculator, packing and weighing, post-sale, "My eBay" management, feedback, and much more. The course will run from 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. with a 30-minute lunch break and will be taught by Carlos Paris, a certified eBay Instructor.

Class cost is \$75 and includes the instruction manual. Eligible Tribal members can access the Noncredit Program (Formerly Short Term Training) for assistance with registration costs. Space is limited to the first 15 who register.
