ebay Training Workshop in Grand Ronde

Interested in learning how to buy and sell items on eBay? You can use eBay and the Internet to make money and/or purchase gifts during the holiday season.

The Noncredit Program will be hosting an eBay training course in the Adult Education Computer lab on Saturday, Nov. 3. This course will cover many topics, including: registering and creating a seller's account, product selection, prohibited items, fees, listing preparation, proper item title and descriptions, taking professional photos, pricing considerations and "how to's," selling formats, item selection and research, selecting payment methods and PayPal, shipping options, shipping calculator, packing and weighing, post-sale, "My eBay" management, feedback, and much more. The course will run from 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. with a 30-minute lunch break and will be taught by Carlos Paris, a certified eBay Instructor.

Class cost is \$75 and includes the instruction manual. Eligible Tribal members can access the Noncredit Program (Formerly Short Term Training) for assistance with registration costs. Space is limited to the first 15 who register.
