

## EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES

### New York Internship

#### Eligibility:

- ◆ Current high school sophomore, junior, or senior (priority will be given to sophomore/junior students)
- ◆ Grand Ronde Tribal member
- ◆ Reside in Oregon
- ◆ Male
- ◆ GPA of at least a 2.5 (cumulative) or 3.0 in previous term
- ◆ Good attendance record (fewer than 4 unexcused absences in the previous term)
- ◆ Good behavior (student must demonstrate maturity and good decision-making skills — students who have had any discipline referrals in the past 3 months must submit an appeal to have his application read)

#### Commitment:

- ◆ Student must commit to being present throughout the entire internship experience (June 8-28, 2008)
- ◆ Student must present to the Grand Ronde community following the trip to New York (July 2008)
- ◆ Student must present to the incoming interns/participants prior to their departure the following year (May 2009)
