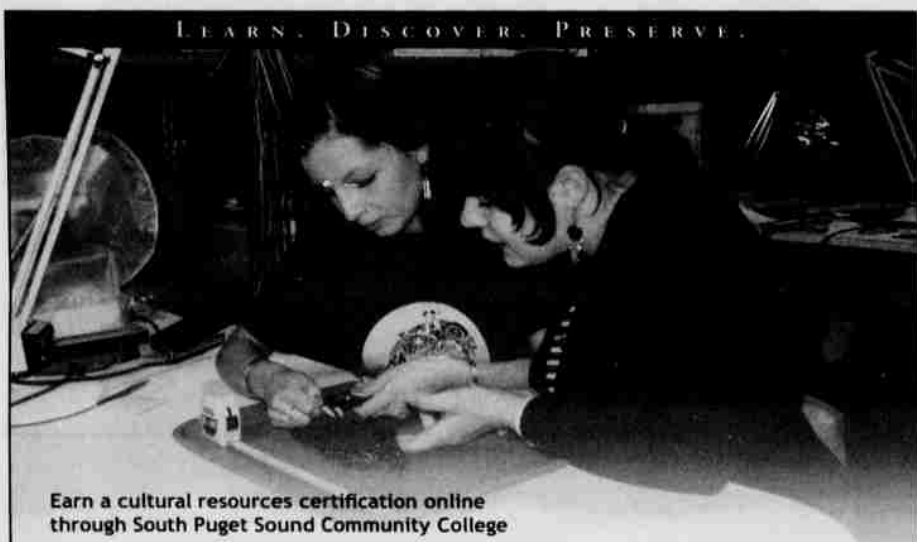

These positions are in the biological sciences and are through the Forest Service, Southern Research Station, Coweeta Hydrologic Laboratory. The rate of pay ranges from \$11.37-\$12.77/hour depending on education and experience. A limited amount of housing is available on-site for \$100/month.

Do you need funding assistance with graduation costs or admission/testing fee costs?

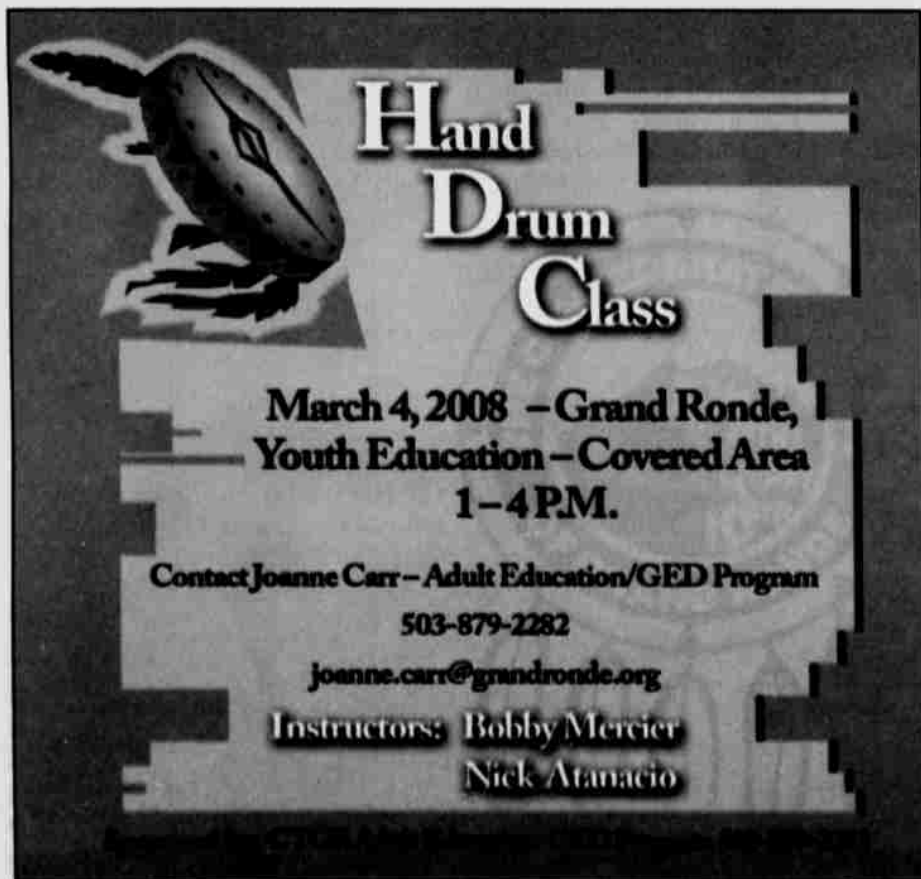
Graduation Sponsorship Program is available to Grand Ronde Tribal members who are graduating from a high school, college/university or trade/apprenticeship program.

Admission and Testing Fee Assistance Program is available to Grand Ronde Tribal members who are applying for admission to colleges and universities or are in need of testing fee assistance for college-level testing (SAT, ACT, GRE, etc.).

The program will pay up to \$200 toward admission and testing fees per academic year.
